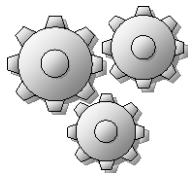

Another talk by our current president on his findings behind a number of catastrophic bridge failures including the Florida footbridge collapse. Maybe he will have some information of the Italian motorway collapse too?

14 MAR Electricity in the North Wales Slate Industry.

Tim Oulton has researched the history of the earliest electrical power generation and its distribution to various North Wales quarries. Cwm Dyli was an early power station that still operates on the south of Snowdon. Kellows and Marconi benefitted from the source of local energy to drive their machines.
